

BUNNY



1. Start with an oval in the center of the page.



2. Add two extra-long U-shaped ears to the top of the oval head.



3. Draw a rectangular body that tapers slightly at the top under the oval.



4. Draw a backward C-shaped tail on the bottom right of the body.



5. At the neck, add a scalloped collar.



6. Draw a little triangle at the top of the head.



7. Fill in the colors!



8. Draw two small black ovals for eyes, two circles for blush, and a little heart-shaped nose and a curved mouth.



9. Add a cluster of dots around the nose and three long whiskers on each cheek.



10. Draw a wobbly oval inside each ear and add a series of horizontal shapes for extra decoration.



11. At the bottom of the bunny, draw two thin V-shaped legs with dots at the ends for feet.



12. Decorate with dots on the collar, a swirl on the tail, and dashes on the ears and the triangle patch on its head.

BE BOLD!

Create a scene perfect for spring by drawing a field of flowers around your bunny. Find all sorts of flower options in the Florals & Botanicals section of the book. Or get Easter ready by giving your bunny a basket of eggs!



CHICKEN



1. Start with a tilted semicircle on the right side of the page.



2. Draw two vertical lines, slightly tilted outward, at the bottom.



3. Add a black dot for the eye and a small triangle beak.



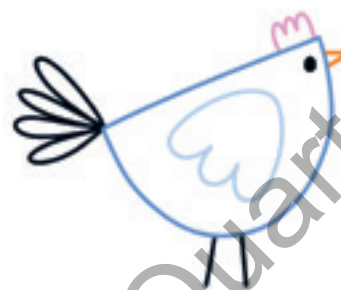
4. Draw the comb with a square with scallops on top.



5. Draw four thin teardrop-shaped tail feathers.



6. Add a U-shaped wing.



7. Add three scallops to the wing for feathers.



8. Fill in the chicken with colors!



9. Add a black line through the center of the beak and a curved line of dashes around the neck.



10. Decorate the wing with polka dots.



11. Add little clusters of grass and dots around the legs to create the ground.



BE BOLD!

Chickens are often found in groups. Give your chicken some friends by drawing a few more in different colors. Maybe even give them a few eggs to take care of.

SHEEP



1. Start with a large cloud shape in the center of the page.



2. Add a rounded triangle with a flat top in the center of the cloud.



3. Draw two oval ears on either side of the triangle head.



4. Add two small, narrow rectangle legs.



5. Fill in the colors!



6. Add two little triangles to the bottom of each leg for the hooves.



7. Add two curves for eyes, a triangle nose, and a curved mouth.



8. Give the wool curly texture by drawing a bunch of swirly lines in the cloud shape.



9. Draw a couple of five-petal flowers with a circle in the center around the sheep's feet.

BE BOLD!

Sheep can come in all sorts of natural colors, or they can have their wool dyed to be any color. How many different colors can you make for a single flock of sheep?

BEAR



1. Start with an extra-long, upside-down U shape.



2. Connect the bottom of the U shape with a wavy line that creates two little nubs on each side and an arch in the middle.



3. Draw two curved ears on the top corners of the bear, then add a smaller curve inside each.



4. Draw one long U-shaped arm on each side of the body.



5. On the lower left side, add a little teardrop-shaped tail.



6. Draw a wobbly square for the snout and a wobbly egg shape on the stomach.



7. Fill in the colors!



8. Add two black oval eyes, a triangle nose, and a curved mouth.



9. Decorate with dots in the ears, curved lines on the tail, and a flower with leaves and circles on the stomach.

BE BOLD!

Do you, or someone you know, have a favorite stuffed bear toy? Make the colors and decorations of your bear match the toy for an extra special drawing.

FISH



1. Start with a long, curved line.



2. Connect another curved line underneath, with the ends on the right connected in a point.



3. Connect the left end with a rounded V-shaped tail.



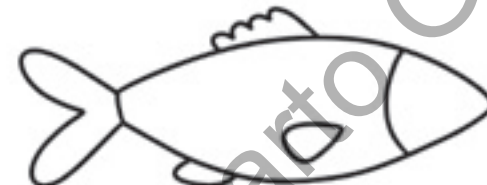
4. Draw a curved line at the top of the tail and another near the right of the fish body.



5. Add a scalloped fin shape on top of the fish.



6. Draw a small teardrop-shaped fin near the bottom of the fish body.



7. Add an elongated U-shaped fin under the body.



8. Draw a thin, curved mouth and two circles for an eye. Split the center circle of the eye in half and only shade half to create a highlight.



9. Add three curved stripes across the body of the fish.



10. Fill in the colors!



11. Add dots to the belly of the fish and more above the head for bubbles.



12. Decorate with a series of lines, dots, and swirls for texture on the fins and body.

BE BOLD!

Complete the scene! Does your fish live in a lake, pond, river, or the ocean? Choose what color the water is and fill in the page with plants and other fishy friends.

LOBSTER



1. Start with a narrow, upside-down U shape.



2. Create a triangular tail with a scalloped bottom edge.



3. Draw two parallel curved lines near the top right of the body.



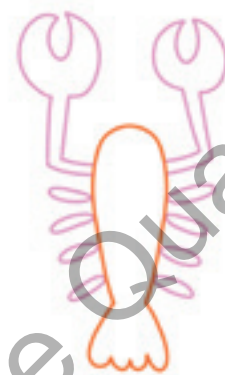
4. Extend the lines up to make a backward L.



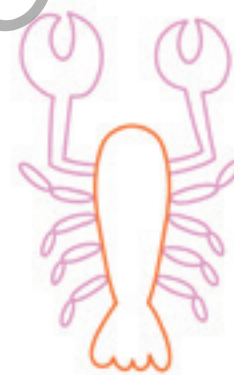
5. Finish the arm with a curved claw shape, using two crescents that connect in the center.



6. Repeat steps 3 to 5 for the left arm.



7. Draw four thin ovals on each side of the body.



8. Add a smaller oval at an angle to the end of each oval.



9. Fill in the colors!



10. Add two black dots at the top of the body for eyes.



11. Draw two curved antennae at the top of the body, overlapping the claws.



12. Decorate with texture lines on the tail and claws and scalloped lines for the shell on the body.

BE BOLD!

Lobsters come in lots of colors, including blue, green, brown, or even a calico or split pattern. Their shapes also can be different, with spines on their shells or one claw bigger than the other. Get creative with what your lobster looks like.
