Atlas of Shipwrecks Maze

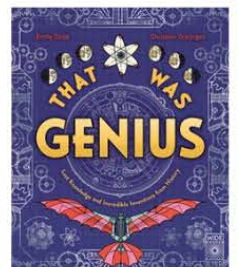
